

## SEX OFFENDER EVALUATION

1. BASIC DEMOGRAPHIC INFO & REASON FOR REFERRAL
2. PRE-TX ASSESSMENT INFORMATION
  - A. Initial DX Interview
  - B. Bio-psychosocial (including but not limited to the following categories of information)
    1. Mental Health
      - a. Physical difficulties/disabilities
      - b. Medications used
    2. Medical HX
      - a. Past TX information
      - b. Medications used
      - c. Past HX of DX
    3. Family & Peer HX (for youth evaluations)
      - a. Including family dynamics & response to the offense
    4. Alcohol/Drug Issues and patterns
      - a. Past TX information
      - b. Medications used (if any)
      - c. Other
3. RISK ASSESSMENTS
  - A. STATIC 99
    1. (not recommended with offenses such as possession of child porn)
    2. Only to be used with adult males 18 & older
  - B. STABLE 2007
    1. Only to be used on adult males 18 & older
  - C. ACUTE 2007
    1. Only to be used on adults 18 & older
  - D. RSVP (Risk for Sexual Violence Protocol)
  - E. ERASOR (Estimate of Risk of Adolescent Sex Offender Recidivism)
  - F. JSOAP-II (Juvenile Sex Offender Assessment Protocol) for males 12 – 18
  - G. JSORRAT-II (Juvenile Sex Offender Recidivism Risk Assessment Tool-II) for male youth
4. ADDITIONAL PSYCHOLOGICAL TESTING
  - A. MCMI-III (Millon Clinical Multiaxial Inventory-III)
  - B. MACI (Millon Adolescent Clinical Inventory)

5. INTEGRATION OF INFORMATION OBTAINED FROM COLLATERAL CONTACTS. May include but not limited to:
  - a. Probation/Parole Office
    1. Police Reports
    2. Prior Record
    3. Results of assessments & red flags raised
    4. Victim information
    5. Education/employment information
  - b. Other TX Providers
  - c. Family members (specific for youth who sexually harm evaluations)
6. ABEL ASSESSMENT FOR SEXUAL INTEREST (for adults & adolescents) and ABEL-BLASINGAME ASSESSMENT SYSTEM (for individuals with intellectual disabilities)
 

*This is a comprehensive evaluation and treatment tool that provides baseline data, treatment planning guidance, and evaluation of progress throughout the treatment process. It evaluates sexual interests and sexual behaviors. It provides the following report items: \*Visual Reaction Time Objective Measurements of Sexual Interest, \*Probability of PAST Child Sexual Abuse (CSA) Behavior, \*Summary of Admitted Sexual Behaviors, \*Summary of Sexual Health Concerns, \*Emerick Sexual Victimization Scales, \*Sexual Behaviors Ratings, \*Sexual Fantasies Ratings, \*Cognitive Distortion Scale, \*Sexual Interest Vignette Scales, \*Social Desirability Score, \*Summary of Drug & Alcohol Abuse, \*Danger Registry, \*Accusations, Arrests, and Convictions, \*Abel Screening Questionnaire Data*
7. INSIGHT INTO OFFENSE PRECURSORS (Failure scenario)
  - a. This may include information about what triggered the current offense, and what may contribute to future triggers.
  - b. Accessibility to victims
8. INDIVIDUAL'S UNDERSTANDING OF THE OFFENSE & AND ITS IMPACT ON THE VICTIM.
  - a. May assist in establishing TX goals
9. PROTECTIVE FACTORS
  - a. What is in place to assist the individual in avoiding relapse ) Eg, community supports, intimate relationships, etc. )
10. DIAGNOSTIC IMPRESSION & FINDINGS
  - a. Amenability to treatment/prognosis
  - b. Internal motivation
11. RECOMMENDATIONS
  - a. Level of care recommendations & recommendation for increased level of care if unsuccessful at this level.
  - b. Recommendation of ability to be successful in community based treatment v incarceration.
